

that puppetry can be a gateway not only for communication but also for learning empathy, behavior modeling, and role-playing. Puppets can also elicit a heightened state of aware-

ness, observation, and understanding. Lindsey "Z" Briggs taught a series of virtual and live classes in October, November, January, and February to over 30 Larc staff members. Ms. Briggs helped classes experiment with the selection of puppets to find the right fit so the puppet is attractive to the

entire class. She also discussed the relationship with and handling of the puppet so that it can be seen as a peer who maintains a special place in each classroom. A professional puppeteer, "Z," plays monster foster mom Dalia on Sesame Street, and the host Foley on a Sesame Street podcast. "We are hopeful that this training will help our Larc family encourage deeper relationships and strengthen their students' confidence and communication skills however these skills may emerge," said Stefanie Riehl, Executive Director.
